Thursday Talk at Jesmond Library: The Geordie Appeaser: Viscount Runciman's Mission to Czechoslovakia in 1938. Thursday 2nd October at 6pm, £3 at the door. Walter Runciman, with his strong links to Jesmond and Doxford, could have been a local hero: but his mission to Czechoslovakia ended in humiliation and was arguably one of the failures which led to Word War II. Mike Fraser talks about what went wrong and why these 1938 events are relevant to us today.
